












Inception of G20

The G20 was founded in 1999 after the Asian financial crisis as a forum for the Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors to discuss global economic and financial issues.














Elevation to Leader's Level

The G20 was upgraded to the level of Heads of State/Government in the wake of the global economic and financial crisis of 2007, and, in 2009, was designated the "premier forum for international economic cooperation".











The G20 Summit is held annually, under the leadership of a rotating Presidency. The G20 initially focused largely on broad macroeconomic issues, but it has since expanded its agenda to inter-alia include trade, sustainable development, health, agriculture, energy, environment, climate change, and anti-corruption.














Inclusion of AU as G20 Member

India put forth a proposal for the African Union to attain permanent membership status within the G-20, a proposal that garnered unanimous support from all participating nations. Hence, the African Union was accepted as a permanent member of the G20.

G20 Members

The Group of Twenty (G20) comprises 19 countries (Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Republic of Korea, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Türkiye, United Kingdom and United States) and two regional bodies: the European Union and the African Union (as of 2023). The G20 members represent around 85% of the global GDP, over 75% of the global trade, and about two-thirds of the world population.







He also stated that he has repeatedly confirmed with Indian Prime Minister Modi that the outcome of the G7 should be feed into the G20.

Prime Minister Kishida pointed out that Russia's aggression is exacerbating the difficulties of the global economy, including on food and energy, and that the G20 needs to address them. He also stressed the need to implement economic policies aimed at realizing sustainable and inclusive growth while correcting disparities, and emphasized the importance of making supply chains more resilient and carrying out revision of principles of corporate governance. Furthermore, Prime Minister Kishida stated that the rules-based, free and fair trading system, with the World Trade Organization (WTO) at its core, is the foundation for global growth and stability, and that Japan would like to cooperate with other countries toward the 13th WTO Ministerial Conference next year.


MARINE LIFE IN DANGER

Results of a study released in 2015 shows a 49% decline in the number of marine species around the world between 1970 and 2012.

The study of marine mammals, ranging from birds to reptiles to fish highlighted that marine life is disappearing faster than conservationists had feared. The figure is actually 10% higher than previous estimates.

The decline is not only bad news for ecosystems but to humans as well, especially to people in the developing world who depends on the ocean's recourses. As stated in the report, the blame for halving global fish stocks falls heavily on overfishing and climate change, with deep-sea fish population down 72% rising water temperatures and increasing acidity have left ¾ of coral reefs under threat and it is possible that most coral reefs could die out by 2050. People also fear that a quarter of the world's sharks, rays and skates could eventually become extinct.

Regarding food issues, Prime Minister Kishida stated that a concrete action plan was formulated at the G7 Hiroshima Summit with the participation of invited countries, which confirmed the value of such initiatives as the "Agricultural Market Information System (AMIS)", launched by the G20 to enhance data gathring, and the "Millet and other ancient grains international research initiative (MAHARISHI)," promoted by India. He also expressed his will to work on building sustainable and resilient agricultural and food systems. He went on to state that he strongly expects that Russia will return to an international framework in which the United Nations is involved to secure global food security.

Prime Minister Kishida introduced that at the G7 Hiroshima Summit, the leaders of the G7 and invited countries shared the recognition of significance of the free and open international order based on the rule of law as well as the principles of the Charter of the United Nations such as respect for sovereignty and territorial integrity. In addition, Prime Minister Kishida pointed out that Russia's aggression against Ukraine, which has shaken the foundation of G20 cooperation, still continues despite the condemnation by most leaders at the G20 Bali Summit last year.

He also stated that it is critical for Russia to withdraw its troops immediately and for Ukraine to achieve a just and lasting peace. Furthermore, Prime Minister Kishida emphasized that Russia's nuclear threat is absolutely unacceptable, let alone their actual use, and that it is necessary for the international community to send out a clear message in solidarity. He also stated that it is vital for the international community to extend assistance to those who are in vulnerable situations under conflicts.

Regarding environment issues, Prime Minister Kishida showed Japan's support to the "Lifestyle for Environment (LiFE)" promoted by Prime Minister Modi, and stated he would work together to transform the lifestyles of people. Furthermore, Prime Minister Kishida expressed his determination to play a leading role in the negotiations for a treaty on plastic pollution, toward the realization of the "Osaka Blue Ocean Vision" regarding marine plastic litter, and with the ambition to reduce additional plastic pollution to zero by 2040.

Regarding climate and energy, Prime Minister Kishida pointed out that the implementation of the Paris Agreement is an urgent challenge in order to limit temperature rise to 1.5°C He called for commitments by all Parties to achieving net zero by 2050 and peaking out global greenhouse gas emissions by 2025, toward COP28 (28th session of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change). Prime Minister Kishida also stated that it is imperative to achieve transformation to a decarbonized economy through inclusive investments without compromising economic growth and energy security.

Prime Minister Kishida explained that the discharge of Advanced Liquid Processing System (ALPS) treated water into the sea has been conducted in accordance with international standards and practices while taking all possible measures for safety, and that the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) Comprehensive Report states that the radiological impact on humans and the environment is negligible. He explained that the data monitored since last month's discharge has been made public in a prompt and highly transparent manner, and that no problems have arisen from a scientific standpoint.







FLUORIDE IN DRINKING WATER AND DEFLUORIDATION OF WATER

Fluoride pollution in subsurface water is a significant problem for different nations across the world because of the intake of excessive fluoride caused by the drinking of the contaminated subsurface. Water pollution by fluoride can be attributed to the natural and human-made agents. Increased levels of fluoride in drinking water may result in the irretrievable demineralization of bone and tooth tissues, a situation called fluorosis, and other disorders. There has long been a need for fluoride removal from drinking water to make it safe for human use. Among the various fluoride removal methods, adsorption is the method most popularly used due to its cheap cost, ease of utilization, and being a scalable and simple physical technique. According to the findings of this study, the highest concentration of fluoride (0.1–15.0 mg/L) was found in Sweden and the lowest (0.03–1.14 mg/L) in Italy. We collected the values of adsorption capacities and fluoride removal efficiencies of various types of adsorbents from valuable released data accessible in the literature and exhibited tables. There is still a need to find the actual possibility of using bio sorbents and adsorbents on a commercial scale and to define the reusability of adsorbents to decrease price and the waste generated from the adsorption method. This article reviews the currently available methods and approaches to fluoride removal of water.
